STANDARDISED TESTING

Standardised testing was completed during the month of May.

Standardised testing in English and Maths takes place annually in classes 1st to 6th.

Early literacy and numeracy standardised tests are also administered in Senior Infants.

Standardised testing is one form of assessment used in schools.

Many other forms of assessment are also used throughout the year.

These include; teacher observation, child/parental feedback, self-assessment, work samples (projects, guizzes and weekly/termly tests.

Standardised tests have many merits but do not measure many aspects of a child's learning and ability. Standardised tests do not measure resilience, creativity, critical thinking, self-discipline, social skills or motivation. It is important that as parents and educators we do not allow our children to be defined by the results of tests. Results of standardised tests will be communicated to you through your child's summer report.


